UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR

Relaxation of Measures

Freedom Day has passed, and we are all readjusting to the relaxation of laws that limited many of our day-to-day activities. With these freedoms also come inevitable concerns for those people who will feel vulnerable to this change especially while infection rates remain high. Let's celebrate the general move towards a resumption of normality but please respect others and continue to be aware of those around you and their needs - even if they are not visible.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Following the recent efforts to stamp out anti-social behaviour (ASB), I have been pleased to see many more uniformed officers in the village and know I am not alone in this. The combination of the Police using the Lifeboat Station and the Roy Underdown Pavilion — both ASB hotspots — have made a tangible difference in dealing with the worst issues.

Feedback from the Police on the Beat Surgeries has been positive. They have been able to talk to far more people and explain the multi-agency plan that is in place to manage ASB at the Foreshore. Although it has been busy and there have been a few minor issues, generally people have been out enjoying the best of Hamble without issue. I know we all hope this will continue.

When problems do happen, we want to make it easier for residents to know how to report them. We have produced a postcard with useful contact details for the Police and listing the different ways to report crime and ASB. Crime reporting directly influences how police resources are allocated, so if you want to see a difference, do your bit by ringing it in or reporting it at https://www.hampshire.police.uk/ro/report/ asb/asb/report-antisocial-behaviour/. You aren't just doing it for yourself but for everyone else as well.

Meeting with Paul Holmes, MP

I recently met with Paul Holmes, our local MP for Eastleigh, and hope that this meeting will be the first of many. We discussed a range of topics from the inevitable congestion on Hamble Lane, the Hamble Halt Park and Ride scheme, crime and anti-social behaviour in the village, the recent legislation that has prevented Councils from meeting remotely, and the Council's future plans. The meeting was very positive, and he took away a number of issues on our behalf. We hope to build on this and invite him back to a public meeting in the autumn.

Coop Closure - Transport Lifeline

Although the closure of the Coronation Parade Coop is now deferred until the end of August (date still pending) we have been working with the Store Manager Daniel, local charities in the area and EBC to provide help to elderly people during the closure. Vulnerable residents will be able to contact Hamble Good Neighbours (HGN) to book a trip to The Square Coop on a Thursday each week during the store's closure. 

WINDHOVER ROUNDABOUT WORKS

Road closures are set to continue as work by Highways England on M27 junction improvements are due to start in September. They are proposing a series of changes at Windhover Roundabout and the surrounding roads starting on Monday 20 September 2021. The works are expected to last for 18 months.

The works are designed to make junction 8 safer, improve poor air quality associated with vehicle emissions, and reduce congestion during Windhover Roundabout peak periods. The works will result in road closures, reduction in speed limits,

narrowing of lanes and closures of footways. A more detailed programme of when elements of the works will start has been requested and will be shared as soon as we have it. Please factor in extra time for travel as you plan activities beyond September.

TACKLING RUBBISH AT THE FORESHORE

We are now in the final stages of replacing the commercial waste bins at the foreshore. A new purpose-designed bin shed will replace the current bins that during peak periods can overflow, creating an unsightly mess. In future the rubbish will be secured inside the shed, which will be locked to prevent fly tipping and to reduce the risk of vandalism. The enclosures will be grey in colour.

One will be located in the current position and another alongside the Lifeboat Station.

It is expected that the bins will be in place in September.

HAMBLE CONSERVATION AREA TOUR

The Planning Committee recently expressed interest in hosting a tour of the Hamble Conservation Area with Councillors from Eastleigh Borough Council's Area Committee to look at changes that have occurred since the policy was last reviewed in 2008. The tour took place on Monday 19 July, and considered The Square, the High Street, Oyster Quay and Ropewalk, Crowsport, and a number of areas that adjoin but are not part of the conservation area.

Following the tour, the Council is hoping that working with EBC, there will be an early review of this key planning document once the Local Plan is adopted. This will give everyone the chance to comment on the special characteristics of the area that people love and cherish in Hamble.

SKY SIGHTS FOR AUGUST

A graceful swan glides overhead in summer skies in the form of the constellation Cygnus. Its tail is marked by the bright star Deneb, while fainter stars mark the flying swan's outspread wings and long neck. The overall shape is that of a cross, and in fact the constellation is often known by its alternative name the Northern Cross – far bigger than the Southern Cross but less celebrated. This celestial swan represents one of the guises of the Greek god Zeus, flying along the starry band of the Milky Way to an illicit tryst. Can you spot him?

One of the year's two best meteor showers can be seen in August. The shower is called the Perseids because it seems to radiate from the constellation Perseus in the north-eastern part of the sky. Meteors are popularly known as shooting stars, but really they have nothing to do with stars at all. They are in fact tiny particles of space dust shed by a comet. As they burn up by friction high in the Earth's atmosphere they create a bright streak of light usually lasting no more than a second or so.

KEEPING HAMBLE TIDY
