# **COUNCIL NEWS**

To start we must thank everyone who completed the Community Consultation survey that will help the Parish Council plan for Hamble's future. In particular it will give it guidance on your priorities when considering plans for its assets and in general how to respond to wider developments in the area. There have been a number of interesting aspects to your responses highlighting what you value in our community. At the time of writing there has not been time to analyse the results which will be completed and reported after the summer recess.

At the last Local Area Committee meeting the planning application to demolish the former Barclay Bank's building and build a new community facility/library was approved. This facility would be on the ground floor with two self contained flats above. It is anticipated the income from the flats will help fund the ongoing costs of this new facility. The Borough Council has set up a working group, including representatives from the Parish Council, to plan how it will be used and managed. The general opinion is that the space must be flexible to meet the needs of its range of potential users and adaptable for changes in the future.

At the same meeting, the application for 64 dementia care centre was refused because its proposed location was in the Bursledon/Hamble/Hound local gap. The committee agreed it was the "right building in the wrong place" and said its was a facility that was needed and asked the applicant to discuss with them other potential sites in the Borough.

As mentioned in a previous 'Council News' the owner of the Beach Hut Cafe has asked the Parish Council if its lease could be varied so that it can sell alcohol to enable its customers to have a glass of beer or wine to drink with their meal. The meeting at which this was considered a number of parishioners attended to object to, but the Parish Council agreed to varying the lease to allow an application to be made to serve between the hours of 11.30 am and 6pm only.

It was also agreed, when HYPE had to vacate the premises at The Hamble School,

Please put this date in your diaries Everyone Welcome Tea Coffee Cake Raffle to review after 3 months the new arrangements of holding its activities in rotation in each of the villages. Andrew Simpson, from the YMCA that operates HYPE, said it had been a difficult start to the new way of working with the core group that they used to work with largely now dispersed. It has been a challenging exercise rebuilding the trust with it users again. Of all the areas Hamble has been the most successful with the best attendance helped by the use of the MUGA. Again, with the organised trips that have been arranged the best take up has been from Hamble.

The Parish Council has set up a new Asset Management Committee to better focus on the oversight and management of its many assets. It has also started to develop an environmental strategy such as ways to improve wildlife areas in the parish. It has agreed to commission a wildlife and habitat survey within the parish and to develop a community orchard with its potential location being at the east end of the College Playing Fields.

Reports of recent Hamble River Valley Forum and Hamble Estuary Partnership meetings have been given to the Council. This included an Environment Agency initiative 'Seaview Mitigation Measures' which includes possible opportunities to

improve the Hamble Estuary. This project is looking at the Southampton Water area to improve the environment to include mitigation measures such as enhance ecology, remove obsolete structures, installing fish passes and realign flood defence. Also, the final results from a sponsored university project were discussed research focusing on the impact of anodes on the Solent and implications for its management. The details will shortly be available on: http://www3.hants. gov.uk/hambleestuarypartnership/ hep-members.htm.

Finally, the Parish Council has reviewed the production of your Village Magazine and has agreed to continue it in full colour after a successful trial period. Other new arrangements will start from the October issue and will be reviewed at the end of the year. The Parish Council has received feedback about how much parishioners value the magazine. The local company that has been responsible for delivering the magazine for many years has given notice that this will be the last magazine it will deliver. The Parish Council wishes to thank Dave Stephens and his team for the service he has provided to the parish and it has been much appreciated.

# Message from the Clerk

Our village survey will be complete by the time you receive this and over the summer we will be looking at the results and identifying the priorities. Not surprisingly congestion in and out of the village appears even at this stage to be high on the agenda. The Parish Council is discussing this with Eastleigh Borough Council and the County Council over the summer feeding back residents views on the current position. Eastleigh's Draft Local Plan is due to for publication on the 20th July 2017 and people should take the opportunity to look at the emerging Plan and to feed comments back to the Parish Council or to Eastleigh directly. You will find details on Eastleigh's website and our forward plan will identify when we will be considering the parish councils response so keep an eye open if you want us to reflect your views.

Using the website is an increasing part of everyone's tool kit including the Parish Council. We have plans to rebuild ours over the coming months but in the meantime it is worth me highlighting the fact that the Council does publish its agenda on the Wednesday before each of its meetings (we meet on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month except during August) and copies are on the notice boards around the village as well as on the website. Usually by the Friday a full set of papers including minutes and supporting reports are published on the website and are used by councillors in their deliberations. We also have a forward plan of meetings that run throughout the year. It does change regularly so I would suggest you check it but it does give residents a chance to see

what issues are being discussed. If you can't get access to the website and need information on a particular report or issue then contact the office for assistance.

Recently we have been talking about ways of being more environmentally friendly in the way we operate and around the village. As a result we have decided to plant a community orchard at College Playing Fields later in the year as well as starting to look at planting species that support other wildlife. To this end we would welcome volunteers to help with the project inparticular young people who might want to get involved. If you do get in touch. In some areas we have reduced or stopped grass cutting and you will see on the next page an article by Steve Uden one of the grounds team who talks about the benefits of leaving grass a little longer. We are also looking to have a wildlife and habitat survey carried out on a number of the areas we look after and from this to build a wildlife map which we hope will help to identify species of interest both the residents and visitors. It also creates an evidence base which we can refer to when looking at planning issues. Alongside this we are also starting to think about how we can use fewer resources and save money and will be looking at energy and water saving measures.



These seem issues that are close to people's hearts with a lot of references to the natural habitats and wildlife coming up in the survey. We are keen to make sure that the work we do is a reflection of what people have identified and if you have an idea or a suggestion that you want us to look at then get in touch.

Alyssa aged 5 has done just that. Her family asked me to include her poster which she made to raise awareness of the problem of dog fouling around her home. It is some months since we covered this topic but with the good weather and people spending more time outside can you please heed Alyssa's plea and make sure that you don't allow your dogs to foul in public areas and if they do clear it up and put it in the bins provided. I hope you like her poster.

A reminder that the office opening hours will change from the 31st July

through to Monday 4th September. We will be open all day Monday and Friday and by appointment during the remainder of the week. We are also considering staying open till 6pm on Mondays when we have Council meetings but will see how afternoon opening works before coming to any firm conclusions.

Lastly we have had people volunteering to help run the new community library and hub which will be built on the Barclays Bank site. Demolition work will start shortly and by September the building works should be underway. Given this it's a good time to let us know if you want to become a volunteer.

Enjoy the summer and all Hamble has to offer.

### Hamble's Training Ship - TS Mercury

Hamble Local History Society



TS Mercury trained boys for the Royal and Merchant navies and it became permanently based at Hamble in 1892. A shore establishment was built and its training ship was moored on the river. It remained for the next 76 years.

In 1908 the famous scholar and sportsman C B Fry became the principal who, with his wife, ran the school for 42 years. The boys endured a tough regime to prepare them for a career at sea, but they also enjoyed sporting and other activities. TS Mercury boys slept on the training ship, not ashore.

During its years of operation around 5,000 boys were prepared for a life at sea. Older Hamble resident's will have fond memories of Mercury Boy's taking part in village events and its band marching through the village.

Snowy White from the Mercury Old Boys' Association will be giving an illustrated talk on the history of the training ship and its establishment, in particularly its relationship with Hamble.

The Mercury Old Boys' Association will be wound up next year, so it is a very appropriate time for this talk about its history.

### The Advantages of Letting Grass Grow Tall

One effect of leaving grass to grow tall is that it allows the grass and other plants such as plantain to set seed and provide food for birds including sparrows and finches.

Insects also benefit from tall grass and varieties of butterfly in their larval stage (caterpillar) feed on grass including Meadow Brown, Gatekeeper, Ringlet, Speckled Wood and Skippers. Tall grasses also provide an ideal environment for spiders, grasshoppers and beetles. The myriad of invertebrates provides a food source for birds an example are the caterpillars in tall grass which provide food for blue tits feeding their newly hatched chicks that can eat 10,000 moth caterpillars before they leave the nest.

It is not unusual to see damselflies and dragonflies flying over tall grass areas hunting for small insects and spiders. Martins, swallows and swifts take advantage of the increased number of flying insects produced when grass is allowed to grow tall.

Tall grass provides damp cover for amphibians such as frogs, toads, and newts and supplies them with the invertebrates that they feed on. Larger mammals may also use tall grass for cover including hedgehogs, foxes and deer. In some areas you might even find harvest mice nesting in tall grass.

Letting grass grow tall is a management strategy and benefits from an annual cut of the grass in the autumn. If a greater biodiversity is the aim, removal of the cut grass decreases the fertility of the soil and encourages more delicate plants including flowering meadow plants and orchids.



We are planning to change the management of specific areas of grassland within Hamble, allowing the grass to grow. The areas that will be affected are Barnaby's Field which is the field directly behind the cemetery. the sloping section at the bottom of College Playing Field and a strip running alongside the Rail Trail between Baron Road and Hamble Lane.

### 100 in Hamble passes a quarter century

Tina Chisnell's project to capture the look and lives of 100 women – aged 1 to 100 – living in the south coast village of Hamble, Hampshire has

passed its first significant milestone. The 25th photograph has now joined 24 others on the website at www.100inHamble.com.

The 25th image is of Meraid Griffin who – at 50 years old – will fittingly hold the half-way position in the final 100. Meraid sailed into the village with her partner six years ago. After a few months of living on the river, she came ashore to Butlocks Heath before finally moving back to Hamble – and qualifying for the 100 – just a few weeks ago.



The 100 in Hamble already spans the ages

from one year old Molly Lambert, to 96 year Betty Dymond. The contrasts and similarities in the short biographies they have provided in interviews with Tina Chisnell make for fascinating reading; from surviving the blitz in the Second World War, to a rushed ambulance 'delivery' trip to the Princess Anne maternity hospital!

"It's been amazing to meet all these incredible women, they all have a story to tell and it's beautiful the way that their individual lives are revealing the history of the village through its people," commented Tina Chisnell. "I originally had the idea about four years ago, but we had just started a family and there wasn't time for it. And then last year I was seriously ill with Encephalitis. It's quite a rare condition, and left me with significant



memory loss. At first I didn't even recognise my husband, and I wasn't sure how many children I had, their ages or names.

"Since then I've been fortunate that my recovery has gone really well, and a couple of months ago my husband reminded me about the 100 in Hamble. It's been the perfect project, apart from the intrinsic value, it's been a wonderful way to reconnect with the village and the people in it."





Application made by Winchester College and College of Air Training ..... the Council oppose this application as this is Common Land, and asked that it be deferred ..... SEPTEMBER 1967

25 YEARS AGO – Foreshore Seats That the cost of buying an existing Foreshore (Baltimore) Seat to be dedicated or donated would be £200 allowing for three year's depreciation and that all future requests be considered by the Foreshore Committee. SEPTEMBER 1992
