Council News

Craig Palmer and Tim Hughes have given their resignations from the Parish Council due to the need to fulfil other commitments and they have been thanked for their work for the Council. The Council is now undertaking the official process to fill the vacancies and if anyone is interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please see page 3 for details or contact the Council Office for more information. It is anticipated that if the vacancies are filled by co-option the applications will be considered at the Council meeting on the 8th January 2018.

Representatives of GE Aviation attended a recent Council meeting to present its plans for developing its sports field. GE Aviation anticipates submitting an outline planning application in February or March next year. Currently the proposal is for 147 homes on the sports field and car park with the football and bowls club facilities retained. It will also include a new access road off Hamble Lane parallel to Lovers Lane and a small number of extra car parking spaces for Coronation Parade. GE Aviation will be undertaking consultation events on 30th November (3-7.30pm) and 2nd December

(09.30am-1230pm) at GE Aviation Main Reception, Kings Avenue.

There have been recent changes to the Coronation Parade refurbishment scheme which will reduce the parking on Coach Road from 6 spaces to four for safety reasons. Despite this, the Parish Council has confirmed its support for the revised scheme and it is now hoped that work can start on site before Christmas.

Hampshire County Council will be undertaking a public consultation on proposals to improve Hamble Lane and it wishes to find out what residents and businesses think. It wants to hear your views on the existing issues, the scope of possible improvements and the potential travel planning initiatives for the wider Hamble peninsula. It is holding a consultation drop-in event in Hamble at the Roy Underdown Pavilion on 7th December from 1pm to 7pm where there will be an opportunity to fill in a questionnaire. This questionnaire is also available online on the County Council's website or at the Parish Council office.

Hampshire County Council is currently developing proposals to improve the A3025 / B3397 Hamble Lane and wants to find out what local residents and businesses think.

We want to hear your views on the existing issues, the scope of possible improvements, and the potential travel-planning initiatives for the wider Hamble Peninsula

The public consultation will take place over a six week period from 27th November 2017 to 7th January 2018. The consultation material can be viewed on the Hampshire County Council website www.hants.gov.uk and a questionnaire can be completed on-line, once the consultation has commenced.

Council News (continued)

The Council's Annual Foreshore Users meeting has taken place with the local police and the Harbour Master attending to speak about their work regarding water related initiatives. Over the last summer they reported they have been working together with the Parish Council to improve water safety and combat anti-social behaviour around the public jetty. They agreed that this was just the start of their Water Safety Plan initiative and further work and improvements are needed next year particularly regarding antisocial behaviour associated with the foreshore.

Jason Scott the Harbour Master spoke about a document he had produced for the Harbour Board entitled 'Swimming in the Hamble River' regarding the risks involved in four areas of the river. He also recommended the RNLI 'Respect for Water' campaign and online videos. Later in the meeting the Harbour Master explained to the Council the background of the Harbour Authority and its responsibilities for safety on the river and environmental issues particularly relating

to development proposals. Planning developments associated with the river require both the Harbour Authority and the Borough Councils approval.

Two Parish Councillors have walked all the Rights of Way in Hamble and have given a report of their findings to the Council. Overall, they were in a pleasing condition although one on Hamble Common identified last year as requiring work is still in poor condition and the Eastleigh Ramblers have offered to undertake the improvement work. The work on the community orchard at the bottom of the College Playing Fields started last month with the planting of the first phase of apple trees.

Please remember if you wish to buy a Foreshore Parking Clock you must do it in December and the Parish Council office is closed from 22nd December. The office will be staffed again from 2nd January and be open to the public on the 5th. Finally, the Parish Council wishes everyone a happy Christmas and New Year.



Message from the Clerk

As we draw towards Christmas there are a rash of consultations taking place which have an effect on Hamble. We are hoping to encourage the organisers to promote these events widely as well as including them in the magazine, on the parish website and through social media. None the less the most reliable way of getting the message out is word of mouth so if you get the chance to make others aware of these important opportunities, please do. It is the only sure way of making your thoughts and ideas known to those that matter.

Hampshire County Council will be holding a consultation on Hamble Lane about options to reduce traffic congestion. Given the overwhelming concerns raised in the We R Hamble survey it is a chance to do something to address the daily problems that we have in using the road. The Parish Council have lobbied hard to raise this issue and we really need people to now come forward with their thoughts and get involved. The dates are 27th November at Pilands Wood Centre, 7th December at the Roy Underdown Pavilion and 13th December at Abbey Hall - all between 1-7pm. A copy of the information will be held in the Parish office if people want to refer to it.

The Council has also been talking to GE Aviation over the last 6 months and a public consultation event is planned for the 30th November and the 2nd December - see page 1 for details.

The MDL consultation on the future of Mercury Marina has also raised interest across the village with a range of views being expressed. The Parish Council have asked MDL that the summary of comments they receive be forwarded to the Council so that we understand how the scheme is being viewed by the community. This will help to shape how the Parish responds if and when a planning application is submitted.

In mid-November the planting of the first phase of the community orchard started. This has been a partnership between the Council and BP with support from Mike Foard Southern Fruit Trees based in Liss. By springtime we should see the first blossoms and assess the success of the location before moving to the next phase later in the year when we hope to involve more of the community.

Ground-staff have also been out planting bulbs in time for spring and were helped at Baron Road by residents keen to get involved. Next year we will develop a larger programme of community planting days having got the permission from other land owners that need to support the project.



Although the days are short we are thinking ahead to longer, warmer days and the foreshore and waterfront. We will be undertaking a short web-based survey asking users of the dinghy park what improvements they would like to see. An event with dinghy park users will be arranged towards the end of January to talk through options.

A range of measures to improve facilities at Westfield Common will also be looked at.

As part of the modernisation of the Parish Office we have a new photocopier. We've agreed that we will offer a photocopying service with a range of charges from £0.40 per copy reducing to £0.30p per copy for runs of 50 or more. Contact the office if you are interested in using this service.



HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS



Anyone living in Hamble will be aware of the historic anti-aircraft gun sited next to Hamble Point car park. The solitary 40mm Bofor anti-aircraft gun represents the role the site played during the War protecting Southampton from low-level air attack. Without care the gun would deteriorate and every year Hamble Conservation Volunteers clean and repaint the gun with appropriate paint kindly provided by BP.

Recently there has been a very alarming development. The relentless forces of the

tide have undermined the foundations of the gun emplacement and without urgent restoration work it will be impossible for the gun to remain where it is.

Eastleigh Borough Council have agreed funding to fence off the gun emplacement whilst further options are considered - watch this space.

An In House Demonstration and Tea Party, starting earlier than usual at 1.30pm, hats will be worn!!.




HAMBLE LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

It was surprising that there was no written history of Hamble Schools, even the two schools currently serving the village did not have a history of their own establishments. The Society's Chairman, Ian Underdown, spent two years researching this important aspect of village life that enabled him to compile a comprehensive history of Hamble Schools that resulted in this illustrated talk and the publication of a booklet giving their histories.

Hamble's first school for all the village children was opened in 1840 with about 80 pupils attending. It was a National School, which was a Church of England School and the Vicar was its manager. The school teaching staff consisted of schoolmaster and schoolmistress and for many decades they were Henry Merwood and Miss Arabella Pannell. At the end of the 1800s an Inspector's report pointed out that the latrines did not have doors and the managers argued that the closets should be left as it was in the interests of morality. Another report in 1900 described the school as ".... in many respects, this is a model village school".

As the village population grew, the school was enlarged. It was re-modelled in 1892 with the vicar offering to advance the costs without the guarantee of repayment. The school took children of the staff at Netlev Military Hospital and during the First World War the Headmaster, Mr Cockrill, was called up to serve in France. In the mid-1920s there were only 3 outside earth closets and an outside tap and the school was also struggling to accommodate the children of the increasing village population. It was enlarged in 1928 facilitated by the generosity of an American millionaire, Mr Emmons, who lived in a large house called 'The Copse' next to the school.

By 1937 it could not accommodate all the



village children due to the expansion of the aircraft industry so a new Senior School was opened at the end of Satchell Lane, taking pupils aged 11 and over until their school leaving age. In the planning stage it was called Butlocks Heath Senior School but on opening its was named Hamble Senior School. During the Second World War air raid shelters were built at both schools and on the last day of August in 1940 the Senior School suffered bomb damage.

In the mid-1940s school meals and free milk had to be provided for the pupils and again the village school could not cope with the increase in numbers. Three classes of the older junior pupils were sent to temporary accommodation at the Secondary School and an infant class had lessons at the Vicarage, until the Junior School was built in Hamble Lane and opened in 1953. At this time the building of Pilands estate led to its children attending Hamble schools thus an increase in school numbers.

The Junior School was a unique design with ramps instead of stairs, central heating, plus double-glazed windows and an insulated roof to keep out the noise of the aircraft engines from the neighbouring aircraft factory and the airfield opposite. The old village school became Hamble Infant School.

lan explained how the schools developed and showed pictures of their activities such as plays, sports and trips, as well as the Parent Teacher Associations raising funds for providing things such as swimming pools.

Over the years the school names changed. Hamble Junior became Hamble Primary School when the old Infant School closed at the end of 1978 and about the same time Satchell Lane was diverted around the now named Comprehensive School. Following this there were many significant curriculum changes, such as the introduction of computers to the classrooms, the National Curriculum, Statutory Tests, league tables and OFSTED Inspections.

The new millennium saw the most impressive Millennium Mural (pictured adove, right) painted on the side of the Primary School ramp and in 2002 the Hamble Community Sports Complex opened in Satchell Lane. The school also gained specialist school status and became Hamble Community Sports College. In 2016 the school was renamed 'The Hamble School' the seventh change of its name during its history.

lan also talked about and showed pictures of other schools that have served Hamble such as nautical, aviation and play schools. This was another very popular and successful talk by lan with the full house finding out new interesting things they did not know about Hamble schools.

Those present were talking enthusiastically about what and who they knew with a common comment that the evening



brought back many happy memories. It was difficult to get some to leave afterwards as they were still talking about their old school memories. Everyone enjoyed it and it was a very good evening.

If you would like a copy of the 'Hamble Schools' booklet you can buy one from the Post Office at Coronation Parade or Blue Bijou in the Square. If you know someone who went to a Hamble school that does not now live in village, it may be an ideal lowcost Christmas gift when you contact them over the Christmas and New Year period.


