

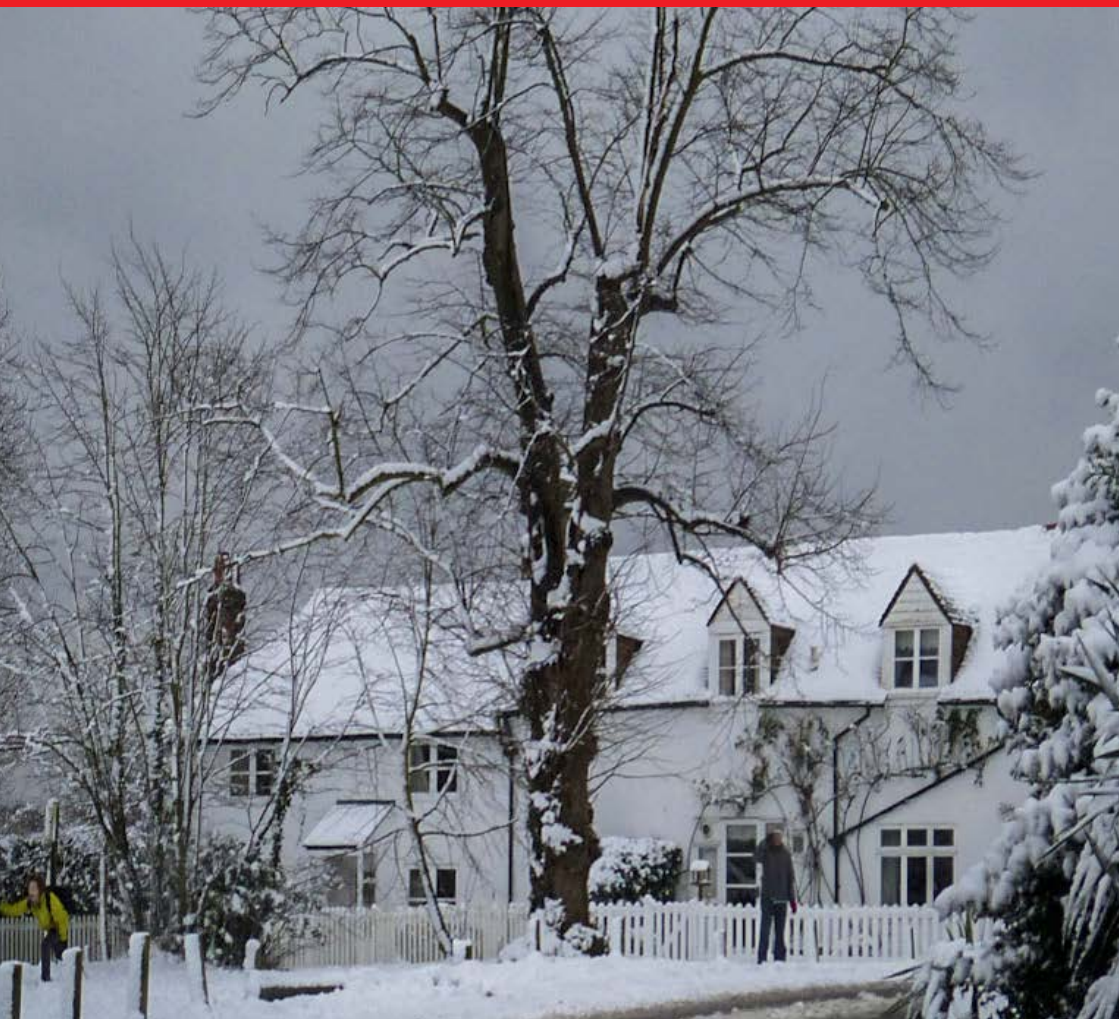

Council News

REMEMBRANCE

Representatives from the Parish Council attended services both in the village and in Netley to mark Remembrance Sunday on the 10th November. The services were well supported as normal and continue to form an important part of village life. Work on the Poppy Trail along Hamble Lane has been completed with a memorial seed mix, based mainly on poppies, being planted to mark the Victory in Europe anniversary next May. Bulbs will also be planted for some early spring colour.

AIR QUALITY

In October, the Planning Committee made a response on behalf of the parish regarding the Borough Council's consultation on its Air Quality Plan. It was supportive of the general thrust of the plan and the actions proposed but it felt that the current Air Quality Management Area should be reviewed to take in more of Hamble Lane. Now it focuses on the upper reaches of the road. It also asked for more

monitoring points at The Hamble School, Hamble Primary School (maybe in Mount Pleasant Car Park) and Coronation Parade. The Committee asked that more attention is given to wider issues such as residents' concerns about the effects on air quality from the industrial complexes on the other side of Southampton Water. There should also be more active monitoring of air quality along Southampton Water to identify pollution caused by maritime traffic. Items such as these should deserve separate consideration in the plan. The Committee finally commented that it is important the targets are more defined and measurable so that it is clear if they have been achieved.

CORONATION PARADE

A project review of the Coronation Parade refurbishment has been undertaken by the Council, although this was a Borough Council project to which the Parish Council contributed £40,000 towards the scheme. The Parish Council has written to the Borough Council giving its feedback on

MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK

Foreshore Benches

In this year's budget the Council set aside £50,000 to refresh the street furniture at the Foreshore. Replacement slats for the benches on the Northern Quay have been purchased and will be replaced on a rolling programme over the next few months. The iron work will also be repainted. This leaves the wood and concrete benches on the Southern Quay which badly need replacing. Suppliers have been asked to submit plans for new seating in the area that make better use of the current space and the grassed area. We hope to have some innovative designs that will then form the basis of a public consultation. Given the iconic status of the foreshore we want to include as many people as possible in helping to make the decision in the new year. There will be scheme options displayed in the office, on the website and social media for people to comment on. Although the work may not be completed by Easter we expect it to be finished before the area gets too busy.

To compliment the improvements, groundstaff will be planting bulbs on the Southern Quay over the next few weeks as well as a number of other areas across the village. At the moment we are concentrating on those pieces of land that we own, but as the programme of planting rolls on we will look to work with Hampshire County Council and Eastleigh Borough Council to plant and improve those areas as well. In time we should have corridors of planting that not only look good but help to support insects and other animals throughout the year.

Elections

Although this is still some way off (and we have a general election to get through first) our own parish Elections will take place on 7th May 2020. This date is posing some challenges for us as we plan our diary of meetings into next year as the 8th May has been set as a public holiday to mark VE day and as a result it is not clear whether the votes will have been counted before our scheduled meeting on Monday 11th May. Given this it has been decided to move our first council meeting of the year on a day to Tuesday 12th May. We also have decided that we will arrange the Annual Parish Meeting after the elections on 21st May which will give parishioners the opportunity to make suggestion about the work of the new council which will serve for four years.

Donkey Derby Field

The Council makes the Donkey Derby Field available free of charge to groups during the year for parking. The field is only available for use for 28 days a year so as a result careful consideration is given to the requests we receive. Priority is given to events that are available to the whole village such as the food and brocante markets but also include the River Raid, River Hamble Games and many of the sailing activities that take place during the year.

The conditions of use have been reviewed and we are waiting for feedback on the changes from the regular users. If you want to know more about it or you are planning a community event next year and would like to use the field, please get in touch as soon as possible.

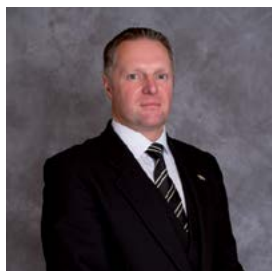

Going Green

There is much in the news about climate change and the consequences of it. Where we can we are taking steps to reduce the parish council carbon footprint by adopting new technologies for plant and equipment as well as our buildings but there is much more we could do. There are simple steps like protecting trees and hedges as a way of reducing air pollutants as well as investigating things like electric charging points in our car parks, increasing opportunities to recycle materials and switching to greener energy suppliers. These are very local issues and it would be good to hear from the community about your ideas. We can't always do things straight away but we have already planted a community orchard, adopted practices such as wood piles and wild verges, converted tools and equipment to battery powered equipment where feasible and are

supporting small recycling projects. Help us to help you do more.

Transforming Cities Fund

Southampton City Council alongside Hampshire County Council (HCC) have made an application to the Department of Transport's Transforming Cities Fund for 2019 - 2023. If successful, the fund would help to improve bus, cycle and walking infrastructure on the Hamble Peninsula. The travel and cycle surveys with employers and employees that we carried out with HCC last year have helped to identify what measures would be most helpful in Hamble focusing on improvements to the cycle route network and improvements to the facilities at Hamble Station. If you took part in the surveys I hope you will start to see some steps that address the issues raised. A decision on the bid will be known in March.

HAMBLE LIFEBOAT AT THE HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT RECEPTION

On Wednesday 16th October, five representatives from Hamble Lifeboat travelled to the Houses of Parliament to attend a reception to highlight the role and issues faced by independent lifeboat stations around the UK.

The reception afforded the team from Hamble and the representatives from the other 17 independent lifeboat stations that attended, the opportunity to talk to several MPs about the services they provide to communities the length and breadth of the UK & Ireland. It was a fantastic opportunity to highlight how important government funding is to keeping these crucial services going – specifically the Department for Transport Grant and the Rescue Boat Grant Fund. The team were also able to speak with representatives from other independent lifeboats to discuss common issues, including: how to raise awareness, fundraising and running costs. There were also two representatives present from the RNLI, which provided an opportunity to forge better relationships between the different organisations.

There are 8 independent Lifeboats in Scotland, 8 in Northern Ireland, 4 in Wales, 38 in England and 28 in the Republic of



Ireland - some of which are inland rescue services - in total, that's 86 identified independent lifeboat & rescue services with 238 RNLI stations across the same region. In 2018, the RNLI Lifeboats launched 8,964 times across their 238 stations. That's an average of 38 launches per station. By comparison, Hamble Lifeboat launched 103 times in 2018, and to date in 2019 has launched on 98 occasions to taskings from the Solent Coastguard.

Hamble are very grateful to the organisers of the event, and to the sponsors for generously supporting it. We are hoping that the event will become an annual one - with the opportunity to run a conference style event next year involving all emergency services.

HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS



Last month we had hoped to make a joint effort with Eastleigh Ramblers and Eastleigh Borough Council on Footpath No 505 that runs parallel with the boundary of the Common with Hamble Point Marina. We understand this section of path is likely to become part of the English Coast National Trail and currently it is barely passable in the wetter months. Unfortunately the wet weather and some exceptional tides beat us to it and the path's condition was so bad that we could not work on it. The renovation has been postponed until the Spring and in the meantime we hope that the one-way valve on the drain pipe that is currently allowing high tides to flood the path can be restored.

We still have plenty to do in the winter

months which give us the opportunity to clear scrub from the Common without the risk of disturbing wildlife.

Regardless of the task we welcome volunteers, the tasks can be arduous but there are roles for a wide range of abilities. Furthermore we appreciate that many people cannot spare the time for the whole task so please do not be put off if you can only be with us for a short time.

of practically nothing.

Joey told us that she studied Floristry, finishing her studies in 2009. She had a Saturday job in a Florist but ended up becoming the manager. She started up on her own which was more flexible for her as she had family commitments by then. She loves her job especially as she does a lot of weddings but she does know that there is a lot of waste in the industry and she has become very environmentally conscious, recycling as much as she can. She said that most flowers we buy are usually wrapped in plastic and also so are a lot that she buys from wholesalers. She told us that she composts all the flowers from weddings and re-uses as much plastic as she can and is very aware of the problem. She does not use oasis (which is not biodegradable), using chicken wire instead which can be reused over and over again. She also dries a lot of the flowers after weddings which she then uses again for other displays.

This evening Joey concentrated on doing a very simple table decoration and it was lovely to see the end result. When doing wedding flowers, she tries to encourage the bride to use flowers which are in season and can be sourced from the UK which can help the environment. She told us that she works alongside someone who does table settings and they are using recycled crockery, cutlery etc which they source from charity shops and car boot sales. She set up a table for us to see how effective this can look and she said it is becoming very popular. Another enjoyable evening.

In November, the Hamble Ukulele Band and singers came along to entertain us with a wonderful repertoire of popular music. We have had this band before and they always manage to perform and give us a very jolly evening playing tunes we all recognise and can sing along to. Some of the songs included 'Crazy Little Thing Called Love', 'Give Anything I Own', 'Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow', a collection of Mexican



Type songs with 'Twist and Shout' to make our toes start tapping. HAMBLE LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

Another full house for the Society's Chairman, Ian Underdown, who gave a very well-illustrated talk about Satchell Lane and he said there cannot be many residential roads in this country that can match its history. Many people were not aware that it was not until the beginning of the 1900s that most of the lane became part of Hamble, as in the previous centuries Satchell was a tithing in Hound.

Its first recorded mention was in 1251 when Henry III granted the abbot and monks of Netley Abbey free warren in their lands of Netley, Hound, Shotteshal (Satchell) and Sholing. Satchell's name changed over the centuries with some variations being Shotshall, Shatsham, Shatshau and Sachel. During this time Satchell was a small agricultural tithing but being close to the river some its residents made their living from the river and going to sea. Satchell Farm was the main centre of activity and its workers lived in the thatched cottages in the lane. On average about 30 people lived in Satchell tithing. The tenant of Satchell Farm often farmed Manor Farm at Hamble and Hound Farm.

A superbly illustrated estate map of 1725 gives the first details of its tenants, dwellings, fields and commons. It appears that Satchell Lane was probably the main road into Hamble. In 1766 William Chamberlayne, a large landowner in the area, took possession of Satchell and his family owned it well into the 20th century. Around this time the central part of Copperhill Terrace was built at the Hamble end of Satchell Lane on a site where coppers for boiling tar for nautical related items were once situated.

During the 1860s a large house known as Ravenswood was built between Satchell Lane and the river, located at the present-day Crowsport. In 1892 the training ship TS Mercury was permanently moored on


the Hamble River where gradually a shore establishment was built in Satchell Lane. In the mid-1890s Mercury View Terrace was built and this was when the lane started to change and develop as we know it today.

At the beginning of the 1900s some Satchell Lane residents asked Hamble Parish Council if they could be included in Hamble. In 1902 most of Satchell Lane from the entrance to Port Hamble Marina northwards, including all the houses, was transferred from Hound to Hamble. Ian went on to show how the houses developed up the lane in the 1900s and the businesses that were located there including its own shop, Satchell Stores.

A major impact on the life of its residents occurred in 1926 when Satchell Farm fields were sold and made into an airfield which Air Service Training took over in 1931 and it became known as Britain's Air University. Ian showed some examples of the inevitable aircraft crashes adjacent to the lane. Satchell Lane was a gravel road and had two gravel pits but by the 1930s its homes had gained public services such as mains water, sewerage, gas, electricity, telephone and the road had gradually been tarred. Crowsport was built in the mid-1930s in anticipation of yachtsmen buying the bungalows for seasonal use during the summer months.

After the Second World War more businesses started up such as boatyards at Badnam Creek, a sailmaker took over the east side farm buildings, a dentist worked from Fullwood and there was a printing business at the Studio. In the mid-1950s a caravan site was established and due to post-war housing shortage it was allowed to use part of the site for permanent residents. In the 1960s a very significant change to the river and Satchell Lane occurred with the development of marinas. In 1964 Port Hamble Marina opened and Mercury

Marina was completed in 1971.

TS Mercury closed in 1968 and later the airfield in 1984 which were to have significant implications. Satchell Lane was bypassed around the school in 1977 to enable the Mercury estate to be built. A 1970s proposal for a small pedestrian precinct near the former entrance of TS Mercury, so that the lane would be divided into two cul-de-sacs, was discussed at public meetings but due to the diversity of opinion of the residents it was never pursued.

Recent developments such as the Community Sports Complex, Blackthorn

Health Centre and the inclusion of the former airfield for gravel extraction in the County's Minerals and Waste Plan were also illustrated by Ian. Over the years there have been five boundary changes that affected Satchell Lane, the last this year extended it to include land on the east side of Hamble Lane up to Mallards Road and the Bursledon boundary that brought all of Satchell Lane within Hamble.

It was most pleasing seeing so many current and former Satchell Lane residents at the meeting who were able to gain an insight into what it was like in the past through the many fascinating pictures.

FROM THE COUNCIL'S RECORDS

100 YEARS AGO - Scavenging The Scavenging Contractor notified the Council that Sanitary Bins at Copperhill Terrace had been provided, but the Cottages on the Quay were still unprovided for.

DECEMBER 1919

100 YEARS AGO - Fire Station Shed A letter was read from Major Curling asking when it would be convenient for the Council to remove the Fire Station Shed from his ground

JANUARY 1920

75 YEARS AGO - Ambulance ... the possibility of the W.R.D.C. handing back the Ambulance to Mr Emmons, the Ambulance kindly placed at the disposal of Hamble A.R.P. at the outbreak of hostilities. After discussion, it was decided to send a letter to Mr Emmons Solicitor to ask if Mr Emmons would allow the Ambulance to be transferred to Hamble Parish Council for use of parishioners until the European War is over.

75 YEARS AGO - Proposed Ferry between the Foreshore & Brook Creek Correspondence was read from Capt. Whitney on his proposed ferry between Hamble & Brook ...

50 YEARS AGO - Planning Procedure The Council expressed criticism of the County Council Planning Authority in respect of their acceptance of an amended application for extension to the Hamble Manor Hotel, which reduced the number of bedrooms from 100 to 80, the scheme included a large underground car park ...

DECEMBER 1969

50 YEARS AGO - Erection of Dwellings adjacent to Daffodil Terrace Advising they have received notification from Jackson & Co that they proposed to use the road names Cerdic Mews and Cynric Road for their development off Satchell Lane.

JANUARY 1970

25 YEARS AGO - Centenary Meeting The Chairman opened the meeting by stating that this meeting had been scheduled especially to take place on the nearest Monday to the date the Parish Council had first been created, 100 years ago on 4th December 1894. All present would be invited to stay after the end of the meeting to celebrate the Centenary and when refreshments would be available.

ADVICE COLUMN BY CITIZENS ADVICE EASTLEIGH

I'm looking online for Christmas costumes for my kids. But I'm slightly worried as I've read stories about some costumes not being fire-safe and some children being hurt because of this. I want the kids to be able to enjoy their parties worry-free, so what should I look for when buying their costumes?

Unfortunately you're right. There have been a number of incidents where children's fancy dress costumes were set alight by accident.

But you can do a number of things to help keep your child safe. Citizens Advice recommends that you:

1) Check the costume comes with safety instructions, a CE marking and the manufacturer's name. A CE marking means the product complies with European health and safety requirements, and the product has been tested for flammability.

2) Keep on the lookout for fake products by checking the CE mark. Sometimes the wrong mark is used entirely. If it looks correct, a giveaway may be the middle line of 'E', which should be shorter than the other parts.

3) Make sure you're buying from a reputable retailer. So, if you're shopping online, check whether you're buying from a third-party seller and try and find out as much about them as you can.

4) Look for things like customer reviews or search for the company online to see what people are saying about them. You can also try contacting the company and asking for safety information.

5) Lastly, you can check whether the product has ever been recalled for an issue before. Visit productrecall.campaign.gov.uk to check.

Citizens Advice also recommends that you speak with your children about how best to

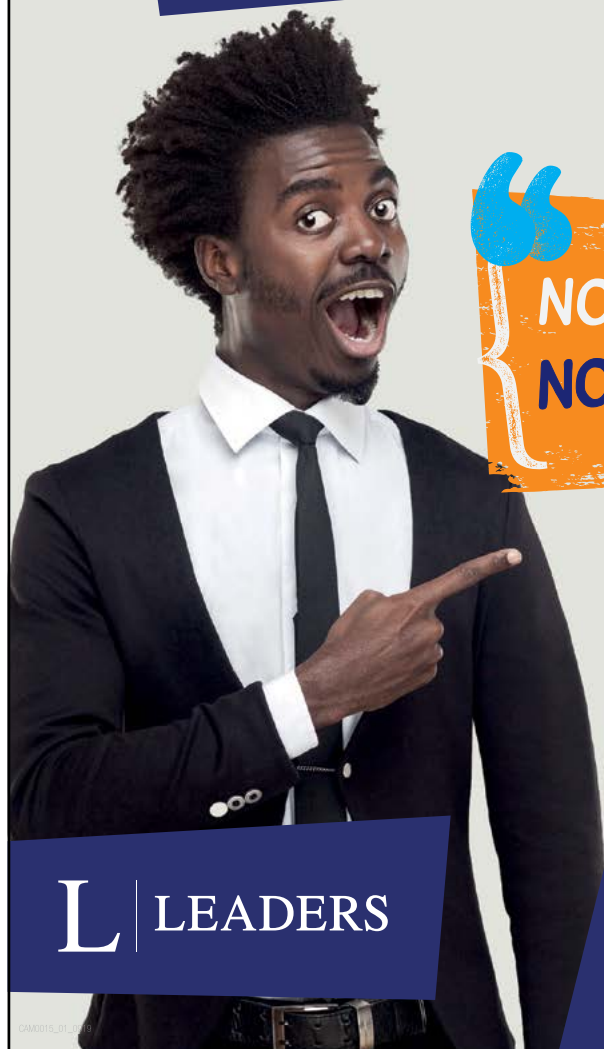
