# GOVERNMENT SUPPORT TO HAMBLE

Like so many others, the Parish Council has seen its income reduce this year alongside having to spend more money on measures to keep people safe and the village clean and tidy. Central government has recognised this and allocated additional funding to local

governments across the country. Eastleigh Borough Council have awarded Hamble Parish Council a grant of £12,204.00 to help plug the hole in our finances which we are very grateful for.

## PLANNING

### Recent Applications

The Planning Committee in October considered two applications linked to the River Hamble. Both related to proposals at Universal Marina. The first was for the rearrangement and additional marine berths at the Marina. The committee objected to the application as it would lead to the loss of the inshore channel used by small boat users including paddleboards and canoes as well as a loss of public space along the river. There was also concern that the more affordable crown estate moorings would be lost in the process.

The second application related to a number changes including the movement of the dry stack. There were concerns that the new location for the dry stack would be very visible from the river and the opposite bank whilst the current location is well screened and landscaped.

### Local Plan Update on Mercury Marina Policy

The Local Plan Inspector has agreed to hold an additional hearing to consider further evidence that EBC has commissioned that supports its objection to residential development on the site. The provisional date for this hearing has been set for Tuesday 5 January 2021 at 10.00am. We will confirm more details about how to join on our website or you can check on EBC's. ### Southampton Airport Extension - Planning Meeting

Eastleigh Local Area Committee will meet on the 17 December 2020 to consider the Southampton Airport Planning Application. The application includes plans to extend the runway and to expand the long stay parking facilities. Members of the public can join and participate in the meeting, either in person or by having their statement read out by a member of staff. ## Allotment Pathway

Back in the summer, Hamble Parish Council started a consultation with allotment holders at the Hamble Lane allotments in response to regular vandalism and damage to the allotments and their crops.

There is a pathway which leads from the layby outside the Primary School, through the allotments, parallel to the main road up to a gated entrance on Hamble Lane next to the bus stop.



Several allotment holders feel that if this pathway were closed it would reduce the risk of continued damage.

In November, the Parish Council agreed to consult village residents in order to gauge public opinion on closing this stretch of pathway to see if this does indeed reduce the vandalism.

The Parish Council has been asked to consider a trial 6-month period from April to September next year, but before we commit to this course of action, we are keen to understand if there are any views about this suggestion or alternative suggestions.

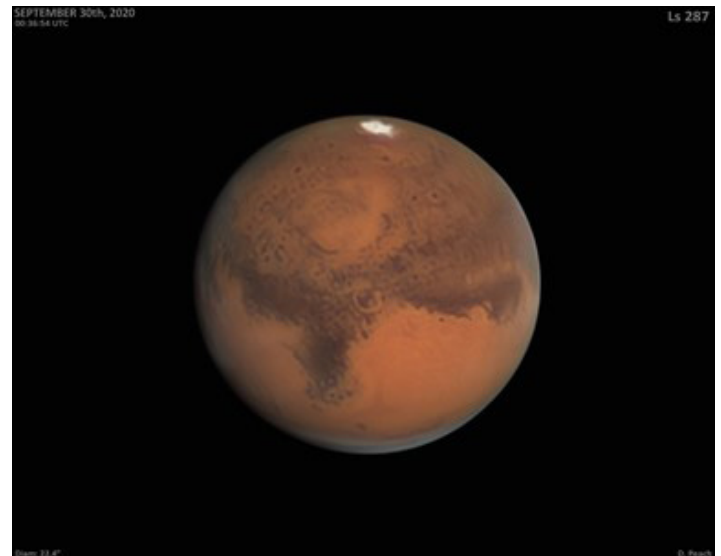

## Natural World

How many residents in the village can boast that they have an asteroid named after them? Well Damian Peach FRAS amateur astronomer, astrophotographer, lecturer and author can. Asteroid 27632 was re-named Damianpeach by the International Astronomical Union (IAU) for his contributions to amateur astronomy which has spanned thirty odd years. Damian's work has appeared in an extensive range of publications, has featured in Edinburgh Science's Festival and The Royal Greenwich Observatory and had been used by the likes of the BBC and NASA.

Many of Damian's images were taken from his back garden in Hamble (more can be found at his website <http://www.damianpeach.com/>).



His image of Mars has recently been featured on the BBC website and if you want to see Mars for yourself it will see it as a bright orange star to the south east in the night skies.

Damian's top tip for December, is the "conjunction" of Jupiter and Saturn on the 21st. With a small telescope or even with binoculars you should be able to see both planets — Saturn with its famous ring system and Jupiter with its cloud bands and Galilean satellites — simultaneously in the same field of view! So, make it a date, and you never know you might spot Damian at the same time!

## Tips to Keep Your Energy Bills Down in Winter

With winter upon us, and more of us working at home, staying warm during the day can be worry. Are you worried if you turn the heating up, your bills are going to go through the roof?

Here are some steps you can take to keep your energy bills in check:

**Everyday tips:** There are little, everyday things that can help, such as making sure TVs and other devices are switched off and not left on standby; washing clothes on a lower temperature; and only filling the kettle with the water you need.

**Get a better deal:** Next, see if you can get a better deal by changing your energy supplier. Citizens Advice has a price comparison tool (<https://energycompare.citizensadvice.org.uk>), and their star rating assesses the customer service records of the 40 biggest companies.

**Talk to your employer:** If your pay is close to the national minimum wage, the extra costs of working from home could be counted as a

pay cut and bring you below the legal level. Talk to your manager or HR department, or your union rep if that feels more comfortable. Finally, your employer should pay for any costs connected to your health and safety – such as a suitable chair for work at a computer. It's also worth taking a look at your employer's expenses policy, you may be able to claim for a number of other things, such as printer ink or telephone line rental.

**Cut costs in the long-term:** You're right in another way about bills going through the roof - and the walls. One way of cutting costs in the long term is to invest in good insulation - or ask your landlord to do so.

## Facilities on the Foreshore

Our public toilet facilities, situated to the side of the Hamble Lifeboat station, remain open throughout the year. During the winter months, we keep one cubicle open and are carrying out regular cleaning to ensure that they are safe.

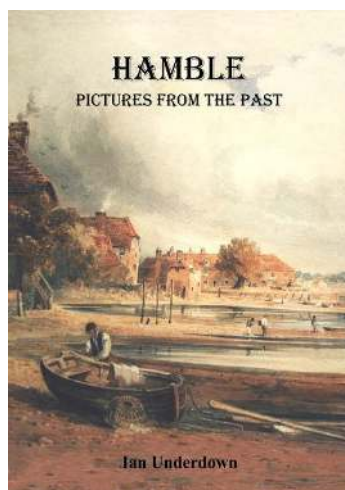
## History Society
