## COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council is pleased to report that it has appointed Mrs Amanda Jobling as its new Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer. She officially takes up her post at the beginning of this month after a few weeks working alongside Brendan Gibbs prior to his departure.

The Council was fortunate to have a number of high quality applicants for the post and we wish her well in her new role that will be both challenging and exciting.

As mentioned in the last Council News the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government has refused the appeal by Hallam Land Management for a development next to Hamble Station. Hallam had the right to challenge the Secretary of State's decision in the High Court within six weeks and this is what has happened. The appeal in the High Court will focus points of law rather than the planning decision itself.

As normal at this time of year the Council has been preparing its budget for the next financial year, including reviewing the costs and prices it charges for the services it provides. The Parish Council has again decided not to increase its precept for 2017/18.

The Parish Council has agreed to make a £40,000 contribution towards the Borough Council's refurbishment of the Coronation Parade area and we look forward to this project being completed before early summer.

At a meeting before Christmas Sgt O'Hanlon and EBC Local Area Manager Matt Blythe attended and spoke about HYPE and their concerns about the continued provision of local youth services. Hamble School has withdrawn its support for HYPE and consequently they will be unable to use their premises from the end of March. Local Parish Councils have been approached about using some of their venues and have been asked to continue giving funding.

The Parish Council has therefore agreed to give £10,000 for another year to support HYPE in 2016/17 and to offer the use of the Roy Underdown Pavilion with its associated sporting facilities.



Plans are now being drawn up for HYPE to rotate around the local parishes to provide the youth services. As part of these new arrangements the Parish Council is seeking conditions to protect local residents from any disturbance relating to HYPE's use of its facilities.

Sgt O'Hanlon also informed the Council that Penny Young has been appointed as Hamble's local Police Constable to replace Mark Arnold.

Hamble Lifeboat attended the first Council meeting of the year to report that work on the public facilities at the new Lifeboat Station had started to bring them up to the required standard. Hopefully when you read this the public toilets will be open for use.

Despite there being no cricket teams wishing to use the Council's facilities at the College Playing Fields in 2017 it has been decided that the Council would preserve and maintain the square of the pitch this year and look at making a final decision about the provision of cricket facilities this time next year.

Due to increasing unauthorised use of the foreshore eurobins by local people these bins have been removed and alternative arrangements for the management of trade waste collected by the Parish Council have been put in place.

Finally, the Parish Council would like to record its grateful thanks to Jackie Bevis as she has now decided to conclude her role as the editor of the Hamble Village Magazine. We are very grateful for all the work she has done over the last five years to significantly raise the profile of the magazine.

We also pass on our very best wishes to Brendan Gibbs as he ends his time here as Clerk to the Parish Council. We wish him and his family all the best for the future.



## **Hamble Local History Society**

The Borrett family and Blue Star Boats in the 1960s

If you have been to the cafe on Hamble Foreshore or taken a river trip from it, the Society's next meeting could be of interest to you. The Society's Chairman, lan Underdown, will be giving an illustrated talk about a business that has been on Hamble Foreshore since the 1930s, now known as the Beach Hut Cafe, but formerly Blue Star Boats and Cafe.

Its first owner Alf Dornom, a Cruising Association Boatman, caused a Public Meeting being called as parishioners feared the loss of their foreshore rights and its character. This resulted in the Parish Council leasing and then purchasing the Foreshore.

You will be able to hear and see how its subsequent owners developed the business, from hiring out boats, moorings and the introduction of river trips to a refreshment kiosk and recently a cafe. Some older residents will be able to remember owners such as Ernie Stagg, the Borrett family and Cliff Hall.

Due to the Foreshore being a public open space the Parish Council would not allow one of its earlier owners to erect a shed to store equipment and shelter in inclement weather, but just permitted a canvas shelter. Over the years the Council subsequently agreed to temporary buildings and eventually a permanent kiosk and cafe.

'From the Council Records' this month refers to Hamble Halt Station and the Thatched Cottages in Satchell Lane. Below is an article about the garage adjacent to station and a picture of the Thatched Cottages.

## **GARAGE BY HAMBLE HALT**

Local residents of Hamble may wonder the origins of the hangar now used by Hamble Garage next to Hamble Halt Railway Station and across the road from the former airfield.

It was built during the spring of 1942 to house six single deck Hants & Dorset buses which were used to convey workmen (and women) from the newly built (January 1942) Hamble Halt to Folland Aircraft Ltd via Kings Avenue or Cliffe Avenue and to Air Service Training (AST) via Sydney Avenue and Beaulieu Road to a point approximately where the entrance to the BP Terminal is now.

Trains from Southampton were met at 7.10 am, 7.30 am, 8.05 am and 8.25 am whilst those from Portsmouth were met at 6.50 am, 7.13 am, 7.40 am and 8.20 am. The six buses ran back and forth until all had been safely delivered to their workplace.

The finishing times at the works varied from day to day although generally speaking, 12.30 pm was the norm for Saturday and 4 pm on Sundays. There were several trains in each direction to suit, one at 6 pm being a through train to Poole as several people from that area worked at Air Service Training.

The buses were various types of 1930s Leylands which had their seats placed longitudinally, decreasing the seating area but increasing the standing room - some were painted in wartime grey, but others retained their pre-war livery.

The service was reduced over the post war years as was the labour force, but was still running during the hard winter of 1947-48, but the Sunday service ceased in 1945.

After the finish of the shuttle service, the garage was used by several local firms and was, for some years, a store for Folland Aircraft and Petters factories.

David Lee, Governor for North Hampshire, describes what motivates him to carry out this role: "With my background as a doctor and a patient, I want the NHS to achieve the best. I am also Chairman of a GP Patient Participation Group and want to encourage and assist with more patient participation work in the Trust."

Nominations for the Governor elections are open until 5pm on Tuesday, 7 February 2017. After nominations there may be a vote in March, after which the successful candidates will be announced.

Anyone wishing to stand for election or nominate a prospective Governor must be a Member of Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust.

## HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS

We are fortunate that a large variety of song birds nest on the Common. We believe that this is in part owing to the provision of bird boxes that protect our birds during the nesting season from predators such as grey squirrels, magpies and foxes. We have sited 30 boxes throughout the Common and our annual inspection and clean of the boxes last year indicated that over 2/3rds of them were used for nesting.

February's task is to carry out the annual maintenance and clean of the boxes so that they are ready for the nesting season. We understand that positioning of the boxes and entrance size is important and we would welcome help from those with the expertise to advise on bird box siting and who could establish the breed of bird making use of the existing boxes.

The high turnout of volunteers for our beach cleans continues and you may be interested in a report produced by Exeter University confirming that the vast majority of beach rubbish originates from land users of beaches rather than tidal action. ## **DOG FOULING AND DOG CONTROL**

The Parish Council office continues to receive an enormous amount of complaints from parishioners on the subject of Dog Fouling and Dog Control.

Dog mess is an eyesore and a health hazard.

If you are a dog owner, you have a legal duty to clean up every time your dog messes in a public place. The law requires people to clear up after their dogs. This applies to all land within Eastleigh Borough, which is open to air and to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access.

Look out for bins marked as 'dog bins' to dispose of your dog bag.

If you cannot find a dog bin, then double wrap the dog bag and place it in a normal litter bin.

Under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 persons who fail to clear up after their dog face either a Fixed Penalty ticket or prosecution through the courts. The penalty for not clearing up dog fouling can be up to  $\pm 1,000$ .

Dogs should be kept on leads in all public and built up areas. Dog owners can face a fine or imprisonment for an out of control dog.

If you see someone not clearing up after their dog or their dog is not on a lead and out of control and know where the offender lives or you can find this out, contact the Animal Welfare Officers on **023 8068 8315/8337**.

They will advise the offender of the legislation.



#### **GUIDE DOGS IS APPEALING FOR DOG LOVING VOLUNTEERS**

Guide Dogs have a training centre in Southampton and are currently recruiting for volunteers to help with the training process.

There are three key stages to a dogs training to become a guide dog. In their first year they undertake puppy training with a dedicated Puppy Walking volunteer. Once they have completed the puppy stage, they then work with a staff member from the centre and complete early training and then advanced training.

We are recruiting for Boarders who either live near our offices in Chilworth, or who pass by it everyday. Boarders look after dogs in either early or advanced training for a period of 10 to 26 weeks. The dog will be with you in your own home during the evening and at weekends. During the day they need to be at the office, so dropped off and picked up Monday - Friday. If you work and can't have a dog of your own, then this is a perfect solution.

We are also looking for volunteer Puppy Walkers. These are volunteers who provide the full-time care and education in their own home for a puppy. The puppy will be with you from seven weeks of age until they are between 12 and 14 months old. They then move on to begin the next two stages of their training.

There are also others way to become involved with your local Guide Dogs centre. We have dedicated groups of volunteers who run events in their local communities and help promote the services Guide Dogs have to offer. We also have volunteer drivers, volunteers who look after collection boxes and a scheme called My Guide where we match a volunteer with someone living with sight loss and together they work towards aims to build the person's confidence and mobility.

75 YEARS AGO – Hamble Railway Halt ..... the original "scheme" included construction of the "Halt" with flights of steps to Hamble Lane on either side of the Railway Bridge ..... If this amendment is carried out, the dangers to pedestrians should be removed ..... FEBRUARY 1942

75 YEARS AGO – Hamble Common A discussion took place over the bad state of parts of the Common where the Military previously occupied ..... that the Common Committee go into the condition of the Common & report, also that correspondence from the Military Authority when they occupied the Common be gone into, to see if they were liable to put any parts in good condition.

FEBRUARY 1942

50 YEARS AGO – Thatched Cottages, Satchell Lane ..... said that he understood the tenants were to be temporarily re-housed as soon as possible. He said that he had visited the Cottages and that they are in deplorable condition and expressed his personal opinion that they appear to be beyond repair ..... The Chairman said that it was surprising what can be done to restore old buildings ..... FEBRUARY 1967

50 YEARS AGO – The Close, Satchell Lane Regarding C.C. taking over the Close and making up the road, the residents were concerned in respect of the Telephone Kiosk situated in the Close ..... asked that the Kiosk be moved, possibly next to the Post Box in Satchell Lane ..... FEBRUARY 1967

50 YEARS AGO – Annual Parish Meeting ..... the following items be put on the agenda ..... That parking of cars on the Foreshore be discontinued as it is an infringement of the Open Space Act .... FEBRUARY 1967

25 YEARS AGO – Honesty/Appreciation Box That an old mine be used ..... for an appreciation/honesty box with all the proceeds going to the Inshore Rescue ..... FEBRUARY 1992
