### Update from Your Parish Council

#### **Woodland Trust**

Following last month's article about tree planting Cllr Andy Thompson has been scouting the parish identifying parcels of land that could be planted up. The council can then decide on a strategy for focusing our efforts.

#### **Flower Power**

By now spring flowers are popping up all over the village. Each year we are planting more bulbs and hope that people are able to get out and enjoy them. We can only

plant on land owned by the parish council although we have formally approached other land owners about both bulb- and wildflower-planting on land they own and hope this can be included for next year.

Last year, we also purchased planters from Eastleigh Borough Council (EBC) for the Foreshore and outside the parish office and have been looking to do the same this year. To reduce our carbon footprint. we have looked for a local supplier as the flowers came from Holland last year. That has given us the opportunity to work with Mayfield Nursery a Southampton-based arm of the charity Solent Mind. As well as supplying a fantastic range of plants, the Nursery supports people with mental health problems and other needs to gain confidence and skills while working in horticulture. We should have more news on the project in the next month or so.

25-year plan for the area), consideration was given to a policy called HA2, which covers the Mercury Marina and Riverside Camping and Caravan Park. The policy identifies 4.7 hectares of land at this site for a marina, hotel, a range of other holiday accommodation and car parking/boat storage. At the meeting, the agent acting for the land owner requested multiple changes to the policy which included: increasing the site area; removing the requirement for a hotel; and allowing residential development to cross subsidise the provision of other holiday accommodation such as lodges.

Following the meeting, Hamble Parish Council contacted EBC setting out concerns about the nature of the proposed changes. As a result, EBC have withdrawn the site from the Local Plan on the following grounds:

- Ecological sensitivities of the site based on evidence previously collected as part of the Local Plan process, the site was discounted for residential development.
- Poor accessibility of the site the lack of footpaths and street lighting along that part of Satchell Lane are not conducive to residential development
- The Council (EBC) is already meeting its housing needs and is directing development away from the peninsula.

The site continues to be designated for marina / boatyard use and will be unchanged by the withdrawal of the policy. In terms of the next steps Christa Masters, the Planning Inspector (appointed by the Secretary of State to conduct the Examination) will now report back to EBC before the end of February setting out her findings. In the meantime, EBC will be drawing up a list of all the modifications made so far, including those to the HA2

policy.

#### **Bofors Gun**



Despite efforts by EBC to move the Bofors gun, discussions are still ongoing with English Heritage about how best to do this so as not to cause any damage. Once it is safely removed work can start on finding a new home for it. Some suggestions have already come in and include: the Southern Quay, the grassy mound at the entrance to the river at Hamble Point or the gun emplacements on the Warsash side of the river. Let us know if you have any other suggestions or a preference from these ideas!

#### Air quality

## WeRHamble

Improving air quality in the village we know is a priority – you told us so in the WeRHamble Survey. Recently, as part of EBC's Air Quality Action Plan, Hamble Parish Council raised a number of concerns about air borne pollution not just from cars but also from industrial activities on Southampton Water. A strategy is due to be considered by EBC shortly but in the meantime, let's try and do our bit across the village. Cllr Dann has recently started a discussion about how to encourage more children in the area to travel to school without getting in the car.

We congratulate the many families who do walk to school each day, but a recent survey of the Mount Pleasant car park indicated that over a hundred cars use the car park on a typical morning for drop-off at the Primary School. Whilst the Council recognises it can't solve this problem on its own, it agreed to investigate air quality monitoring in the area, to discuss the situation with the school and to encourage parents or carers with any ideas on how to promote less car use for the school run to come forward. The Council does have a community grant fund and would welcome proposals that would help to tackle this issue.

In the meantime, if you are taking your child to school please think twice before leaving the engine running – either to keep warm in the winter or cool in the summer – research shows that those inside a car in a congested area have a higher exposure to pollution than those on the outside. In either event it is just adding to the problem.

#### **Community Use of Parish Facilities**



Steve Harris, manager of Hamble Club Youth FC, attended February's Council Meeting to promote the annual youth tournament which is to be held at Mount Pleasant on consecutive weekends at the start of July. The event which will run on 4th, 5th, 11th and 12th July and will attract over 1000+ visitors over the two weekends. The Club now has over 430 young people on

their books and the tournament is a great opportunity to showcase young talent. It is also an important fund-raising activity to support the work of the Club throughout the year.



Other events that take place in and around the Foreshore were also agreed at the council meeting and, as usual, the foreshore will be busy hosting a range of activities from River Hamble Games and the River Raid to the Farmers and Brocante markets.



To make sure that parking is available, the Donkey Derby Field will once again be in use although it can only be used for a maximum of 28 days in a year due to planning restrictions. Recent history around the field and the restrictions on its use have almost taken on mythical status – to dispel the myths we will provide a potted history of the site in the next edition – so if you want to know more, check out next month's magazine!

#### Did You Know - Who Governs What in Hamble?

Many people are unclear about which council does what in Hamble, to whom should a complaint or suggestion be directed, and how the General Election impacted on Hamble Parish Council?

Fist, let's take a look at some of the key

points...



Hampshire County Council (www.hants. gov.uk) are responsible for the delivery of national services such as transport, education, social care, libraries, and waste management.



Eastleigh Borough Council (www.eastleigh. gov.uk) are responsible for more local services, such as street-lighting, refuse collections, planning applications and road maintenance.



Hamble Parish Council (HPC) (www.hambleparishcouncil.gov.uk) are responsible for managing a number of communal areas within the village which includes the Foreshore and Westfield Common; the cricket and football pitches; and children's play areas as well as overseeing the allotments and rear cemetery as well as the foreshore car park

and dingy park.

In addition, HPC also owns land and buildings which it leases out to organisations such as the sea scouts and squash club on Hamble Lane and promotes use of the foreshore for events and markets.

#### Who is on these Councils?

Hampshire County Council is comprised of 78 elected county councillors representing each of the 76 divisions within Hampshire. Currently, 55 of these are Conservative, 19 are Liberal Democrats, 2 are Labour and 1 Independent. Hamble is one of the 76 divisions and is represented by Councillor Keith House @CllrKeithHouse (of the Lib Dem party).

Eastleigh Borough Council (EBC) is governed by 39 elected local councillors. Currently, 34 of the 39 elected councillors are Lib Dems, led by Cllr Keith House.

As you will probably be aware, Eastleigh is represented in the Houses of Parliament by our local MP, Paul Holmes @pauljholmes from the Conservative Party who was elected in the General Election in December 2019, replacing Mims Davis (also Conservative, elected in 2015).

Just to be clear; we're represented in Parliament by a Conservative MP and in the County Council by a Liberal Democrat. The country has a Conservative Prime Minister but the local administrative governance is the responsibility of a Lib Dem majority. Not at all confusing, right?

#### **Does Hamble have a political bias?**

Several of the other local parishes within Eastleigh have a number of their parish councillors who are also members of Eastleigh Borough Council.

Significantly, Hamble Parish Council differs in this regard and is predominantly

politically neutral with only one politically affiliated Parish Councillor.

#### Why is this significant?

The 12 volunteer councillors (pictured, below) who sit on HPC do so because they



are passionate about making Hamble a better place. The discussions, options and decisions made reflect purely the interests of those living and working within our lovely village – rather than trying to align to a regional political agenda or fight ideas purely because they were suggested by a different political party.

We're really proud of this autonomy and firmly believe it results in a better outcome for the people of Hamble.

As a result, the long answer to the original question is that the General Election and even Borough Council Elections don't have a direct impact on Hamble Parish Council. However, the people of Hamble have a massive impact on Hamble Parish Council, as the 12 councillors are elected by you every 4 years. The next local elections are this May when we will be asking you to vote for who you would like to represent your interests within the village or even stand yourself (see below for more on this).


# Are you interested in becoming a parish councillor in Hamble? If so, read on...

We hold Elections every 4 years to elect 12 candidates to form the Parish Council. If you stand to become a councillor you should expect to complete the 4-year term. To qualify to stand you must be 18 years old or over and be a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen and are either registered as an elector in Hamble, or are an owner or tenant of land/premises in Hamble or your principal or only place of work for the past 12 months is in Hamble or you have lived in Hamble for the past 12 months or within 3 miles of it.

If you do want to stand, then Eastleigh Borough Council who manages the election process, will be hosting a briefing event on Thursday 12 March 2020 at 2pm in rooms 11/12/13 at Eastleigh House, Upper Market Street, Eastleigh S050 9YN. If you would like to attend please contact Sam Jones directly on the following email: sam.jones@eastleigh.gov.uk.

The notice of election will be published on Wednesday 1 April with nomination papers being accepted by the Returning Officer at Eastleigh House between 10am and 4pm from this date until close of nominations on Wednesday 9 April 2020 at 4pm.



#### What is Southampton City Vision?

Southampton City Vision will be the new Local Plan for the City of Southampton, a document that will set out the future development of new homes, work spaces, infrastructure and facilities across the city over the next 20 years and beyond.

#### **Our vision**

Much has changed in Southampton since various local plan documents were published. We therefore intend for Southampton City Vision to replace some of these older documents in order to provide new, up-to-date and relevant planning policies. Southampton City Council (SCC) wants Southampton City Vision to be a place shaping tool that is both city wide and community focussed, meeting the development needs of the city whilst recognising the needs and diversity of individual communities.

Developing the Southampton City Vision document will be a lengthy process that will bring together a wide number of technical studies and all the information collected through our consultation exercises.

One of the main challenges of producing this plan is to ensure that SCC address the city's key issues whilst meeting the Government's and legal requirements.

To meet these requirements, the plan will have to: identify land for new homes and workspaces, maximising the potential of space available; provide necessary

infrastructure and facilities to support the growth of the city; and protect and enhance the environment. However, SCC would also like their plan to: recognise individual neighbourhood identities; connect us with our waterfront; and encourage growth and further investment in the city.

#### So, where are SCC now?

SCC are currently at the start of the plan preparation process, part of which involves conducting an initial consultation exercise to ensure we have a good understanding of what people and businesses in the city need. This initial consultation, which runs from 10 February to midnight on 19 April 2020, is your opportunity to start shaping the plan. 
#### Celebrating 100 Years of Agatha Christie

#### Hamble Ladies: From Christmas Dinner to Pets as Therapy

I know Christmas 2019 is a distant memory for most of us - well let's face it even what we had for dinner yesterday can be at times - but our Christmas dinner at The Beach Hut in December was once again a success.

The team served up an amazing dinner and you couldn't ask for a nicer place to be and sit with friends and enjoy yourselves and to start off our Christmas celebrations.

Thanks again to Phil for all your effort and please book us in for next year.

In January we held our AGM. The weather was dreadful but we were pleasantly surprised when about 15 members turned up. We made the most of it and sat around with coffee and tea and a catch up.

The committee has stayed the same with myself as Chairman, Joan Fitzgibbon as Secretary, Dawn Brook and Anne Bastard looking after the finances and Maggie Smith and Jenny Cudmore in charge of the tea and coffee and helping us in lots of other ways. We have been doing it for a good many years now and it seems to be getting more popular with new members joining from month to month.

In February we were visited by Laura Hamilton and her beautiful 'Pets as Therapy' (PAT) dogs. The two white golden retrievers were called Pilot and Lily. Lily was one of Pilot's litter of puppies which were born over 5 years ago with Lilly being very small and extremely ill. There didn't seem any hope of Lily surviving but with a lot of love and care Laura and her family have nursed her and she is now a fully operational PAT dog along with her mum. Lily is still very poorly and has had other major illnesses in her short life and now is being treated for cancer but she was a joy to see and very inquisitive, affectionate and even ended up

on the lap of one of the members.

Laura has been awarded the Citizen of Honour Award by Fareham Council for her dedication to 'Pets as Therapy' and together with Pilot and Lily they have done over 500 hours of visits. They visit two schools; one weekly and the other twice weekly. They also visit The Firs Care Home in Locks Heath, Hamble Heights and Avon Park amongst other places.

The charity 'Pets as Therapy' was started in 1983 with 3 dogs but has now become nationwide with 25,000 dogs and 150 cats. The breeds of dogs which are ideal for PAT dogs are Labrador retrievers, golden retrievers, border collies, greyhounds, lurchers, just to name a few. PAT dogs can be very calming for patients and it has been proven that the comfort they bring does improve health. They are sometimes also used to calm students before exams, with patients with clinical depression, stroke patients and also help with people who are phobic about dogs. There is a 'read to dogs' programme which involves children actually reading to dogs, the children then feel comfortable doing this with no one to correct them and it helps to boost their confidence. Apparently, the dogs love it too and get rewarded with lots of tit bits and cuddles.

Dogs have to be 9 months old and the owner has had to have them for 6 months or more. The dogs have to prove that they are capable of sitting quietly, disregarding any distractions, calm around other dogs, happy to be made a fuss of and have their ears and tails pulled. They must like to be groomed and accept food without grabbing what is on offer. As you can imagine this is quite a tall order especially for quite

#### History of the River at Bursledon

Jeff Martin, Bursledon's expert on its village history and Chairman of Bursledon Local

History Society, gave an illustrated talk on the 'History of the river at Bursledon' to the Society's last well-attended meeting that included visitors from other local villages. He started by giving evidence of local Roman activities and the later period when salt making was important to Bursledon. He illustrated this by showing pictures of how this was done near Hacketts Marsh, although its production ceased about 1500. Jeff used maps to show details of the village and why shipbuilding was important. Bursledon was nationally important for shipbuilding as it was a safe location, allowing early warning of an attack, had sheltered but deep water and a good availability of timber. The first royal ship built at Bursledon was the 'St George' in 1338 and it was launched by the King, Edward III. The 'Grace Dieu', the largest ship ever built in England in the early 1400s, was laid up at Bursledon and her remains are a protected wreck in the river today.

At times of war, merchant shipbuilders were offered contracts to build naval vessels but it was a risky business with many of them going bankrupt. In the 1600s, William Wyatt was successfully building 80-gun ships at Bursledon and in the 1740s Philemon Ewer was another significant Bursledon naval shipbuilder. At the end of this century, George Parsons was successfully building naval ships including Nelson's 74-gun 'Elephant'. Details of supporting local industries were explained such as iron making.

In the 1700s Bursledon's population was about 200 and only topped 600 in the 19th century. Jeff then went on to describe



the village's pubs. The Red Lion and The Swan were on each side of the river to provide refreshments for those waiting to cross. There were also The Ship & Launch by Lands End Hard and the riverside Jolly Sailor pub that had a shed alongside it to store dead bodies recovered from the river until an inquest was held at the pub. The Jolly Sailor's important association with the regatta was also illustrated.

The only way to cross the river in early times was by a ferry, but in 1800 a wooden toll bridge was built as part of a road scheme between Portsmouth and Southampton. Initially there were structural problems that were rectified by George Parsons. A railway bridge was built in the late 1880s and this again had problems with landslips of the embankments during construction. The railway led to a boom in the strawberrygrowing industry but cut off many houses from the river and completely changed the landscape. The toll bridge was freed from tolls in the 1930s and a new concrete bridge constructed. In 1975 the M27 motorway bridge was opened.

Jeff illustrated how merchant sailing vessels from the north of the country brought coal and other goods to Bursledon Pool to be distributed locally; including to Botley by

After the First World War many 70ft naval motor launches were for sale and some were converted to houseboats and Deacons Boatyard started business. The story of Bursledon's riverside activities could not be told without mention of the popular 1980s television series

Howards' Way.

His talk concluded by moving further up river to explain about Maidenstone Heath, brickmaking at Hoe Moor, plus Upton and its shipbuilding site. Those present were enthralled and impressed by Jeff's presentation, particularly with its detail some of which many had not heard before.
