UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR

In normal years we tend to have a summer break in producing a newsletter. This is partly because we don't hold council meetings during the summer and much of our news comes from this source. However, we have decided to produce this extra edition - which I hope you will enjoy.

Although it is quieter during the summer, we still see a steady stream of contacts from residents on a wide range of issues. Although as a Parish Council there is a narrow range of services for which we are responsible, we nonetheless try to help people wherever we can, and signpost to lots of other organisations and services. In the last few weeks, the office has dealt with problems with the roads around the village and especially speeding on Satchell Lane, leading to speed advisory boards being sited there for the first time. There have been reports about the condition of local footpaths and our team have been out cutting back the undergrowth in areas for which we are responsible. We have been approached about a hum that is audible in and around the Parish Office especially at night (if this is an issue for you, please let us know), and have had people approach us about concerns linked to planning issues.

Anti-social behaviour remains high on the list of residents' concerns although the Police Surgeries down at the Foreshore Car Park have provided us all with a direct way of raising issues with the Police and was even visited by Paul Holmes MP and Donna Jones, Police and Crime Commissioner for Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. We hope that this high-profile visit will help to keep the issue of anti-social behaviour high on the agenda as we know this is an ongoing concern.

As well as helping people with their problems we have also been busy working with Eastleigh Borough Council (EBC) to explore how best to support local businesses as we come out of Covid. EBC secured funding from the European Union to help stimulate High Streets across the borough and the Local Area Committee has decided to use part of this funding to support a twice-monthly market until December. The market will take place in the Square Car Park every third Friday, and in Netley on the first Friday of the month. A variety of goods will be available, with a nice balance between craft and food items as the market becomes established. Why not pop along and support the market and while you're at it pop into the village shops, pubs, cafes, and restaurants to show them your support.

Enjoy the remainder of the summer, stay safe, and enjoy Hamble. If you're having fun out and about, don't forget to share your images with us, or indeed of things of interest that catch your eye.

SPOT THE DIFFERENCE

The 'K3' in Hamble Square was designed by Giles Gilbert-Scott in the 1930s and is better known as 'The Red Telephone Box'. This has now been given a long overdue facelift, courtesy of two complete strangers who have become friends, Donna Stephens and Judith Allen.

As Donna and Judith were preparing and painting the box, various people stopped to look and make encouraging comment. One in particular remarked that they could remember the time when the phone was "press button A and button B".

If you have a vivid imagination, the box could be used as a library for the exchange of books, maps, or photos; it could be used as a potting shed, a shower room, or a bar with optics and bottles of wine, or just a picture gallery. However, our phone box is in working order and owned by BT so none of these ideas can be put into practice. BT have promised to replace the broken glass in the door, which we hope will happen sooner rather than later as we have ordered the carpet and curtains.

We hope that the residents of Hamble enjoy the facelift, and that 'The Red Telephone Box' is now worthy of pride of place in the village of Hamble.



MONTHLY MARKET ARRIVES AT HAMBLE

Hamble Parish Council, in partnership with Eastleigh Borough Council's Borough Markets, are pleased to welcome a new monthly market to the Square Car Park.

Hamble market will host some of the same stalls as the current weekly market that takes place on the former Budgen's site in Hedge End. Among those stalls in attendance at the first Borough Market in August were Flamingo Paperie (gift cards, wrapping paper, notelets), The Sweets Ladies (sweets and treats), Peartree Cottage (preserves and chutneys), Wood Crafted by Derek (handmade wooden utensils and toys), Ethel's Pies (home-made savoury pies), Monarch Creations (fine art), Nova's Nursery (plants), Bare Bones BBQ (burgers

and hot dogs) and the Scoop Boutique ice cream van. Many more are hoping to join in the coming months.

This venture is part of our COVID-19 recovery plans to help local businesses promote their products and services at high profile locations in the centre of the Borough villages. The outdoor market in Hamble will provide the opportunity for local residents to safely shop in the village centre and allow businesses to have an outdoor space to sell and promote their products or services. In particular it will be helpful for those smaller businesses that may have to limit the number of customers on their premises or need help to raise their profile after lockdown earlier in the year.



- Rental and sharing schemes, for example baby equipment hire, toy libraries and 'Libraries of things'

- Second-hand school uniform services
- Refurbishment of electricals and electronic equipment donated from households to support those in need

The fund is open to applications from community groups, schools and colleges, charities and not-for-profits, faith groups and SMEs.

Many people will have been saddened to hear of the passing of Claude Terry New on 7 August. He touched the lives of so many in Hamble and the surrounding area with his generosity of time and positivity.

An all-time supporter of local people, Claude to some and Terry to others, was heavily involved with Hamble Good Neighbours, volunteering for nearly 50 years to help the elderly or less able in the village. From its start in the 1970's, Claude was a regular helper, assisting with DIY, gardening, and transport issues. 48 years later, he was still giving up his time for others.

SKY SIGHTS FOR SEPTEMBER

The Milky Way, a misty band of light stretching overhead from horizon to horizon, can be seen on summer evenings. You might at first mistake it for a streak of thin cloud but turn binoculars on it and it breaks up into a mass of faint stars. When we look at the Milky Way, we are actually looking through the densest part of our Galaxy, a vast spiral of stars like a catherine wheel. Our Galaxy is over 100,000 light years in diameter but only about 1,000 light years thick. In places, clouds of dust in our Galaxy obscure the stars behind, creating what appear to be huge dark rifts. One such rift is particularly noticeable in September

skies, stretching from the constellation Cygnus, the swan, down towards the southwestern horizon. Astronomers estimate that our Galaxy contains at least 100 billion stars. The Sun is just an average member. Do any of the billions of other stars out there have planets like the Earth with life on them? We can but wonder.
